
Anyway, this campout took a very interesting turn, in the cooking department. We had brought two stoves, one of the big ones and one of the small ones.



How can we cook it? Let us count the ways

On Oct 19, Troop 314 took a camping trip to a place we'd never been before: Holcomb Valley Campground, just north of Big Bear Lake. The Big Bear location was requested by Trumen, so you see we really do try to let the boys choose!

The scouts made their lunch (hot dogs) on the small stove while lan tried a new device -- a solar oven! -- to heat up the adults lunch. But wouldn't you know it, it got cloudy and the solar oven wouldn't heat up. So we used a dutch oven to heat it up, but I didn't use enough charcoal. So lan tried another method -- the engine block of the van.



He put his foil-wrapped lunch on the exhaust manifold and ran the engine for a few minutes. It "kind of" worked. It could have used more time, but he was too hungry.

Then, later, when the stove wasn't even on, the propane regulator suddenly sprung a leak and began loudly venting propane (this was the little stove, not the big one). We quickly removed the propane bottle (we were using the little 1-lb bottles), but we were unable to fix the regulator, so that stove was out of commission.

Then I discovered that I had forgotten to bring a big propane tank for the big stove, so that was also unavailable. So, for cooking, that left one choice -- the fire.



For dinner, the scouts had pizza, so they cooked it over the fire ring on the built-in grate, and we adults cooked bacon-wrapped hot dogs on skewers over the fire.





Both methods worked fine. We also heated chili in the can, over the fire. In the morning, without a stove, Ian and I were thinking we'd just do without breakfast, but then I got an idea. I started up some charcoal in the chimney starter, then put a couple of tent stakes on the top, and voila! I had a rocket stove! But I could cook only one thing at a time.

I first put a pot of water on, which boiled very quickly, and had myself a cup of coffee. Then I filled he pot with cooking oil and heated that up for our breakfast -- Scotch Eggs -- which are deep-fried hard-boiled eggs in a "jacket" of Italian sausage, breaded. It took two tries to get the cooking time right, but it actually worked very well! You can see a video of them cooking, if you follow the link at the end. I think I like this method of camp cooking!



So, in all, we used **SEVEN** methods of cooking! Stove top, solar oven, dutch oven, engine block, campfire grill, skewers over campfire, and rocket stove!

This campout also featured navigation by the stars (until the sky clouded up), and verbally checking off other RTFC requirements. Trumen finished everything for Second Class!

By the way, we also got beautiful views of Big Bear Lake, and we stopped on the way out so that Trumen and Ryan could feel the cold water (it was very cold). We had to deal with some traffic on the way down the mountain, but overall, it was a fun campout, and I want to thank Trumen for suggesting the location.
